ILLINOIS STATE LAW requires that all children entering Illinois schools for the first time, prior to the date of entering kindergarten, and prior to entering sixth grade, have a physical examination by a qualified physician and be fully protected against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, polio, measles, German measles, mumps, and varicella. Students entering fifth grade must have proof of completion of the Hepatitis B series of three (3) vaccinations.

In addition, parents/guardians must present proof of a health examination upon enrolling in a Forest Ridge School District 142 school for the first time, regardless of grade.

Children whose parents or guardians object to health examinations or immunizations on religious grounds, or for medical reasons, may be exempt from examinations or immunizations upon the presentation of a mandated statement of objection to the local school authority.

If required, please have the attached forms filled out by your physician and return them to the office of the school your child will attend.

Children will not be allowed to attend school until the proper medical forms have been received and all the immunizations are complete and up to date.

Please call the school nurse if you have any questions regarding the physical examination or immunizations.

Doctor appointments for physical examinations are sometimes difficult to obtain, so please do not delay in calling for an appointment. The enclosed information from the Cook County Department of Public Health explains its' services for immunizations, school physical examinations, and dental care.
